DELEGATE ORIENTATION

2019 Great Lakes Conference Annual Meeting

WELCOME to the Annual Meeting of the *Great Lakes Conference*. It is the hope of the Great Lakes Conference Board that these pages will acquaint delegates with the procedures and information for this meeting, described in the **Constitution of the Conference** as the **General Assembly**.

The **purpose** of this Annual Meeting is the same as the purpose of the Church of Jesus Christ - at all times and in all situations - <u>to discern and to do the will of God</u>. Depending on the circumstances, there are several ways this may be done; the circumstances of the Annual Meeting - the size of the delegation, the complexity of the issues that will come before us - require that we proceed more formally than is usually necessary in smaller Christian gatherings. We proceed according to the *Conference Constitution and Bylaws* as well as <u>Robert's Rules of Order</u>, Newly Revised. At first, some of the language used on the floor of the Annual Meeting may seem strange to you, but you will soon understand it as a kind of oral "*shorthand*" that keeps the business moving along. A brief glossary of some common parliamentary terms is at the end of these pages. The reason for a rather strict adherence to these rules may be stated as follows:

- It protects the right of the majority to decide
- It protects the right of the minority to be heard
- It protects the rights of individual members, both those present and those absent
- It prevents a "railroad" of the Annual Meeting by manipulation
- It prevents an emotional "stampede" of the Annual Meeting.

Though other elements are factors, three elements basically determine the direction of each Annual Meeting:

- the delegates
- the Boards and Commissions of the Covenant particularly the Executive Board
- the Moderator.

I. THE DELEGATES

The individual delegate is the principal "building block" of the Annual Meeting. This person must act to receive the reports, to approve recommendations, and to question and debate the issues. Every delegate has the right to speak in the Annual Meeting, but those who do not speak are just as vital to the process as those who do - the power of decision rests with all the delegates.

Discussion, debate, the exchange of ideas and information are, however, at the heart of the process, so these are encouraged. Here are some **guidelines** if you wish to speak on the floor of the meeting:

- 1. Approach a microphone and wait for the Moderator to call on you.
- 2. Seek the floor only when the subject you want to talk about is under discussion.
- 3. When you have been recognized, speak to the Moderator and tell him/her what is on your mind. You do not have to make a speech to the Assembly; you are speaking to just one person, and the others are listening in.
- 4. If you have a question about procedure, ask the Moderator; if you have a question about the subject under discussion, the Moderator will call on the person who is most likely to have the answer.
- 5. You may speak once to an issue, and not again on the same issue as long as someone

else, who has not yet had a turn is seeking the floor.

If you have an item that does not relate to the proposed Agenda and you wish to present it to the meeting, it is preferred that you present this, in writing, to the Moderator prior to the Annual Meeting. Opportunity for changes and/or additions is given at the time of adopting the Agenda.

II. BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

The Members of the Executive Board, and others so designated, are the chief "resource persons" on the floor of the General Assembly. The Executive Board is the mover of almost all the recommendations that arise from the Agenda, which it also prepares. All recommendations are subject to the amendment, referral, or rejection of the Annual Meeting.

As the mover of most of the recommendations on the Agenda, a spokesperson for the Board is usually granted what the Rules call "preference in recognition." This is the privilege of a mover to speak first to his own motion. (Please note that motions arising from a Board, Commission, or Committee do not require a second; they already have more than one supporter.)

III. THE MODERATOR

The Moderator of the General Assembly is the Chair of the Conference Executive Board. The Moderator's responsibilities are:

- to interpret and apply the rules of the Meeting
- to expedite the business of the Meeting
- to see that all persons involved in the Meeting are treated fairly
- to clarify what is happening
- to advise delegates in the procedures of the Meeting
- to maintain the discipline and joy of Christian fellowship.

A final word about "decorum" in the Meeting. There are rare times when spontaneous applause expresses affirmation and unanimity in the Meeting, but applause during a debate, when there is an obvious difference of opinion, is not fair to the opposing side.

Motives of other persons may never be impugned during a debate. The merits of the motion, and not the motives of the mover, are the issue under debate.

When the Meeting is in session, move to and from your seat quickly and quietly.

A BRIEF GLOSSARY OF COMMON PARLIAMENTARY TERMS

AMEND, MOVE TO - Most motions may be amended on the floor of the Meeting, particularly when they deal with the business rather than the procedures of the Meeting. When an amendment has been seconded, it must be debated and decided, or otherwise dealt with, before the motion it seeks to amend may be further considered.

APPEAL, FROM THE RULING OF THE MODERATOR - A delegate is testing the Moderator's ruling against the opinion of the Meeting. The motion to appeal requires a second. An affirmative vote by the Meeting sustains the Moderator's ruling.

BALLOT, TO ORDER THE VOTE ON A PENDING QUESTION TO BE TAKEN BY - The Bylaws and Rules specify that certain questions be decided by ballot. Questions other than these may also be decided by ballot if a majority of the Meeting concurs with a request from a delegate for it.

DIVISION OF THE ASSEMBLY - This is a vote by rising. It may be demanded by any delegate to verify a vote taken by a voice or by show of hands, or may be ordered by the Moderator when a vote by show of hands or by voice has been "too close to call." If it is still not

possible to discern the outcome visually, the Moderator may order a count by the *Sergeants-at- Arms*. A majority of the Meeting may also order a count.

INFORMATION, POINT OF - Asking a question about the business at hand.

MR. or MADAME MODERATOR - The traditional form for addressing the Moderator from the floor of the Meeting.

ORDER, POINT OF - A delegate calls the Moderator's attention to a possible breach of the Rules. If the delegate is not satisfied with the Moderator's subsequent explanation, he may <u>appeal</u> if the point has been raised concerning an actual ruling of the Moderator.

PARLIAMENTARIAN - An advisor to the Moderator on Parliamentary Law.

PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY, POINT OF - Asking a question about the application of the Rules in the business at hand.

PERSONAL PRIVILEGE, POINT OF - A delegate believes that his rights or the rights of another are being infringed upon.

POSTPONE TO A CERTAIN TIME - A delegate may move to postpone the item under discussion until a later point in the Meeting. The motion requires a second and is debatable.

PREVIOUS QUESTION, MOVE THE - A motion to cut off debate on an issue which requires a second, and a two-thirds majority. An affirmative vote merely cuts off debate and is <u>not</u> a vote on the motion under debate.

PUTTING THE QUESTION - Taking a vote

RECONSIDER, MOVE TO - A motion to reconsider an item previously voted upon may be made at any time, though it may have to wait until other business has been dealt with before it can be taken up. If a majority decides that the item previously voted upon will be reconsidered, debate on it re-opens, and another vote is taken (or it is otherwise disposed of, by referral, etc.). The motion to reconsider has unique characteristics: It may be made only by a delegate who originally voted with the prevailing side on the item; it may be made no later than the day following the original vote; it cannot apply to an item when provisions of it have already begun to be carried out (such as the signing of a contract); and it cannot be itself reconsidered.

REFER, MOVE TO - Not to be confused with a motion to <u>table</u>. A referred motion goes to a Board or Committee as designated by the *Motion to Refer*. It requires a second and is debatable.

SECOND - A seconder need not agree with the motion or vote for it. He need only agree that the motion deserves the attention of the Meeting.

SUSPEND THE RULES - It is possible to suspend a rule that is standing in the way of accomplishing what the Meeting clearly wants to do either by motion or by unanimous consent. Bylaws may not be suspended unless they are in the nature of "rules of order." This is a complex issue, with each instance subject to the interpretation and ruling of the Moderator.

TABLE, MOVE TO - (Or "LAY ON THE TABLE") Unlike a referred motion, a tabled motion goes nowhere. No one considers it, or studies it, or does anything with it, until a motion passes to "take it from the table." If this never happens, the tabled motion is never again considered.

Great Lakes Conference Treasurer/Financial Officer's Report 2018

The GLC affirmation of faith is captured in the following quote: Jesus asked Peter, "Who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter replied, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Matthew 16: 15-16

The GLC team has a great story to tell about how the Lord was at work in our Conference in 2018, a year of blessing [and challenge] as told in the numbers.

Balance Sheet – The General Fund cash balance decreased from \$588,790 in 2017 to \$546,647 in 2018, a \$(42,143) reduction primarily due to declining General Fund church support. Despite this decrease, our cash position remains very strong.

Our co-guaranty with the ECC on 8 GLC church loans with National Covenant Properties totals \$2.178 million. The GLC is the obligor on a Mission Meadows loan with a balance of \$299,029. Although we believe our risk to be minimal, we have a \$75,000 loan guaranty reserve to reflect our exposure.

Income Statement – The tough news for 2018 is that Church Support totaled \$500,277, our lowest level of support since 2010 and \$(69,700) below budget. Operating expenses of \$600,500 were below budget by \$42,800, primarily due to reduced expenditures on contract services and church planting. As a result, we ended the year with an operating loss of \$(51,786) compared with a budgeted loss of \$(23,109). This operating loss excludes church planting; those expenses are charged to established provisions, as noted in the Balance Sheet. Including church planting, our operating loss was \$(150,381) compared with a budget of \$(104,811). Church support is the critical component of the GLC's financial viability.

2019 Budget – The proposed operating budget excluding church planting for 2019 is a \$(35,000) loss, with \$89,300 funded by the established reserves. A major Board decision is that all future Church Plants will be pre-funded [utilizing ECC support, designated donations, and GLC fund balance transfers] prior to the adoption of the Agreement, which is a 5 year commitment of funding and human resources.

As indicated in the opening comments, 2018 included both blessing and challenge. The goal of the GLC remains the same, however; that we strive to have each Church in the Conference be healthy and missional in our quest to spread the Good News of the gospel. **Bottom line:** We have truly been blessed! The hard work of Staff, Board, and church partners has prepared a solid foundation for ministry expansion in 2019 and beyond. May God continue to bless our efforts to serve Him.

Of note is that in 2017 the Board approved a tenet for future church plants that "all new church plants will be fully funded with firm commitments prior to signing the Agreement", which obligates the GLC. To provide seed money for future planting, the Board voted to establish a \$300,000 reserve, highlighted on the Balance Sheet.

At year-end 2018, the reserve balance = \$146,862 with Church Planting commitments of \$142,065 providing \$4,797 for future plants

This schedule highlights the Board's management of its operating performance adjusting for the establishment of Church Planting reserves in 2017.

These results showing operating losses in 2018 and another loss budgeted in 2019 highlight the importance of General Fund Church Support to the financial health of the Conference. In 2018 Church Support came in \$(69,723) below budget, which resulted in a \$(51,786) operating loss and a reduced Church Support budget of \$500,000 in 2019.

Church Support of \$547,972 in 2017 was our 2nd best year but decreased significantly in 2018 to the lowest level since 2010. Church Support is the life's blood of the GLC's financial viability. A heartfelt **THANK YOU** to our church partners for your faithful support of the GLC mosaic of ministries.

Mission Friends giving is comprised of general support to the GLC budget and designated support for church planting.

Covenant Support is comprised primarily of a 50/50 sharing arrangement for Church Planting which leverages funds to optimize Church Plants

Regional Leadership Conferences are planned to provide resources to the local churches. Leadership Conferences are an integral part of the expanding GLC mosaic

Oil Royalties are generated from GLC rights at Portage Lake Bible Camp; all royalties are remitted to the Camp as Outreach Support of its ministries

For many years the GLC provided loan support to its pastors; presently only one loan with a balance of \$8,526 is outstanding

In 2012, the GLC installed Rev Garth McGrath as its Superintendent. Working alongside Garth are: Rev Shelley Kurth, Director of Church Vitality; Rev Alan Tumpkin, Director of Church Planting; Rev Kevin Butcher, Assistant to the Superintendent; Jody Eidnes, Office & Church Planting Manager; Kari Griebel & Laura Garvey, Administrative Assistants; and Kim Carlson, Financial Officer

Financial counseling is provided by Jack Nichols on behalf of the Conference.

Staff travel is an integral component of the Conference ministries, as Garth, Alan & Shelley log countless miles per year visiting our 80 churches and 3 camps [in Kentucky, Michigan, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia, West Virginia, and Tennessee] plus our prospective church plants.

In 2016 a vehicle was purchased for Garth's use. An annual reserve is established to replace this vehicle every 4th year @ 150,000 miles

Administrative costs are kept to a minimum and account for less than 9% of budgeted expenses.

The GLC's insurance/risk management needs are provided by The Rockwood Company, the same provider used by the ECC

Church Development continues to increase in importance as existing GLC churches face the challenges of maturing in a difficult environment.

Existing Church Development funds are utilized to assist mature churches with pressing needs.

Midwest Ministry Development is an ECC program designed to enhance local church ministry.

A major initiative was the addition of the position of Director of Church Vitality, currently staffed by Shelley Kurth. Shelley's availability to our existing churches represents a GLC commitment to assist our core base of churches.

Leadership Conferences held in East, West, & South locations have been well attended and well received by the attendees. A highlight in 2018 was the Leader's Forum on Human Sexuality featuring Dr. Preston Sprinkle. In 2019 events are planned to maintain the positive momentum of Leadership Development.

Our Pastor-in-Crisis Fund receives its primary source of funds from the goodwill offering at the GLC Annual Meeting and these designated funds are an invaluable tool to assist GLC pastors in a time of critical need

Spiritual Direction Development support provides funding for the development of a clergy/lay network of spiritual directors who will be available and willing to serve the pastors and congregants within the GLC. Support for this ministry has been suspended in 2019 as the GLC attempts to balance its budget in total.

The GLC's Church Outreach ministries are spearheaded by our two Bible Camps, Portage Lake in Northern Michigan and Mission Meadows in Jamestown, New York. In addition, support is also provided to Mountain Mission Camp in Virginia, an outreach of Wallens Creek Covenant Church.

Camping support continues to be an integral part of the GLC mosaic but an effort is being made to have the Camps be self-sustaining due to the GLC's recent operating losses.

The funds provided for special ministries [NAJO, the Japanese mission effort in Detroit, Covenant Community Care Health Clinic's *Courage to Care* event, and Safe Harbor Christian Communities, a member of Covenant Enabling Residences] have been suspended in 2019 as the GLC attempts to balance its budget.

Church Planting has been a ministry priority for the GLC since 2001. In the last 17 years the GLC has planted 32 new churches; 19 of these are active with a combined attendance of 3,600. In 2018 there were 755 conversions/recommitments to Christ. This is powerful Kingdom work!

In 2017, Discover Church, Avon OH, launched in 2010, closed. Two churches launched in 2009 closed in 2018: Life Church of Mt Juliet TN and The Bridge in Detroit MI. Church planting is a risk/reward ministry adventure that tests our resolve and can be extremely challenging.

The exciting news for 2019 is launch #33, LifeChurch Auburn Hills MI, which held its first service in February and is off to a great start. The 2019 budget includes a Residency for Phillip Carr and 2 additional Assessment Center visits by prospective planters.

Not only are our church plants our fastest growing churches, they are strong supporters of the overall GLC mission, giving \$102,612 in 2018 [20.5% of the total].

It is only possible to plant new churches if we have a healthy base of existing churches. As we work for greater health in Church Development/Church Vitality and greater mission through Church Outreach, with all our churches, we are able to broaden our base for all aspects of the GLC ministry mosaic.

Highlights include:

- -- In 2004, the ECC allowed the GLC to retain 100% of the proceeds from the sale of the Erie, PA church; this provided incremental funding of \$137,376 which averted a significant loss and provided the foundation for aggressive church planting initiatives ever since. In 2010, the GLC remitted the deferred 50% share back to the ECC
- -- Until 2010, Church Support increased each year. The faithful investment by our GLC churches has enabled the Conference to aggressively pursue new ministries.
- -- 2011 Church Support was an all-time record of \$552,974 with 2017 our 2nd best @ \$547,972. What a blessing!
- -- 2018 Church Support declined dramatically, however, a major concern for the future ministry efforts of the Conference
- -- Mission Friends has been a complementary source of funding from churches and individuals who deeply believe in the GLC's ministry mosaic.
- -- Church Planting revenue comes from the ECC in partnership with the GLC in shared mission; these funds are leveraged to support the Church Planting expense category. In the last 10 years, the GLC has invested \$2.2 million in Church Planting initiatives to spread the gospel.
- -- Church closures [Erie PA, Hudson OH, Rochester NY, Buffalo NY, & Hudsonville MI] while painful, have provided almost \$800,000 in funding for Church Planting & Church Vitality initiatives.
- -- The GLC's ten year "bottom line" results have been an "up and down roller coaster ride" with alternating loss years and surplus years, highlighting the importance of our support base of churches and individuals. Our heartfelt thanks to all who commit prayers and resources to the GLC mission!

I have reviewed the financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2018 for the Great Lakes Conference of the Evangelical Covenant Church.

The scope of a review is substantially less than that of an audit. Procedures of an audit include detailed analysis and verification of many items on the financial statements. A review focuses more on an analytical review of the amounts, as well as verification of select items. The procedures I applied to the financial statements were not intended to give complete assurance of all items on the financial statements, but instead an overall review of the financial procedures and a reasonableness review of the numbers.

During my review I spoke with the financial officer regarding financial procedures and general ledger recording, verified year-end cash balances through 3rd party statements, reviewed payroll items, reviewed select invoices and related payment, scanned the general ledger for large or unusual items and performed analytical analysis on the financial statements. I relied on information given to me by the financial officer.

The financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2018 accurately reflect the financial transactions and position for the Great Lakes Conference of the Evangelical Covenant Church.






