Workshop Descriptions

1. Daring to Be Brave Led by Dr. Mary Hendrickson - ECC's Director of Missional Vitality

Are you courageous enough to take an honest look at how your church is doing? Jesus said, "Then you will know the truth, and the truth shall set you free." (John 8:32) Notice that the promise is of freedom not of fear. Come learn helpful discussion questions for taking an honest look at the effectiveness of your church, as well as sample the church health survey developed for the Covenant.

2. The Dynamics of a Healthy Church Chair - Lead Pastor Relationship - Session A is for Pastors; Led by Superintendent Garth McGrath Session B is for Church Chairs.

The Church Chair and Lead Pastor of a local church both play significant roles in the leadership of the local church. When they work well together and pull in the same direction, the church is more likely to flourish than if they do not. This workshop provides insights and practical tools that Lead Pastors and Church Chairs need to work well together in order to help their church advance the mission of God in their community effectively. The workshop is intended for current Lead Pastors and Church Chairs who have not participated in previous Church Chair training events.

3. Undercover Visits: Are visitors seeing what you think they are seeing? Led by Rob Hall - Vice President of National Covenant Properties

Do you ever wonder what a visitor sees when they attend your church for the first time? Chances are a first-time visitor is not seeing your church in the same way that regular attenders do. In this session, Rob will share his experience doing undercover visits for local churches, highlighting some of the surprising things he has seen. Come and learn how the perception of your church property will help with visitor retention.

4. Remembering Your Place in The Story

Led by Joe Muzzi - Lead Pastor at Crossroads Community Church and Matt Ness - Lead Pastor at One Church

Remember how the LORD your God led you all the way in the wilderness these forty years, to humble and test you in order to know what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep his commands. Deuteronomy 8:2

It's easy to forget. We have things to do and we get pushed along by the tyranny of the urgent. There's a meeting, there's a budget, an appointment, a leaky roof and we just keep going and going. And so we forget, we forget who God is, we forget who we are, and we forget The Story. It's The Story of love that God has been creating since the beginning. Join us as we pause to remember. Join us as we seek to reconnect and rediscover The Story, our place in The Story, and all the ways God has led us and will continue to lead us.

Workshop Descriptions

5. Leadership that Ensures Change Led by Alan Tumpkin - GLC Church Planting Director

In the exploration of leadership within scripture, we find a rich tapestry of examples that illuminate both commendable and flawed leadership styles. Each way has patterns or modes of operation by which they lead. How can we learn best practices to lead well, and to develop catalytic leaders? In this workshop, Alan will delve into these scriptural examples to identify catalytic leaders—those whose influence inspires transformation and mobilizes others toward living out God's agenda. By examining their attributes and actions, we can extract best practices that not only enhance our own leadership capabilities but also empower us to cultivate catalytic leaders within our communities.

6. The Missing Ingredient in 2025 Discipleship: Aligning our Lives to God's Design for Sex Led by Noah Filipiak - Author and Lead Pastor at Mosaic Covenant Church

If 75% of Christian men & 40% of Christian women report consuming porn with some level of frequency, and the average age of first exposure to porn is 9 for boys and 11 for girls, why aren't we talking about it more in our churches? Why is being transparent about this reality still seen as taboo and stigmatized? It's time for the Church's view of discipleship to go deeper and put conversations about sex and porn in the primary arena of basic Christian discipleship, not a hidden away niche for "those people". "Those people" are all of us! Satan's days of silencing the Church while Christians suffer in isolation are over; Jesus' day of his grace transforming us has arrived! In this workshop, you'll receive the resources you need to create movements of freedom in your church & youth ministry, while discovering that the topics of sex and porn are really about our identity in Christ and spiritual formation.

7. Mission Meadows Work Projects - all day or half day Led by Jackie Haines - Director of Camp Mission Meadows

There are many work projects to choose from at Mission Meadows.

#1 Gardening - there are many gardens and flower beds that could use some love.

#2 Painting - there are several buildings that need a fresh coat of paint, both inside and out.

- #3 **Building** Camp is in the midst of building a new structure, so if you've got skills in framing, drywalling, wiring you name it they'd love your help! Don't worry the camp staff will be around to oversee everything and to ensure safety on site.
- #4 **Trail Maintenance** the trails need to be kept safe by removing sticks and brush so that the campers can explore all that nature has to offer.

#5 Cleaning - keeping all the areas clean is always needed.

Camp will provide all the necessary equipment, but if you have some favorite gloves or tools, feel free to bring them.


